

2015 FUTURE ANGUS STOCKMEN SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES AND APPLICATION

The American Angus Association and Allflex USA want to ensure the next generation of commercial cattle producers is equipped with the tools they need to be successful by extending a scholarship program to young men and women involved in the commercial Angus business. Youth and/or their parents/guardians must use Angus genetics in their breeding program. Eligible Future Angus Stockmen participants seeking financial support for an undergraduate degree are eligible for a \$1,000 scholarship donated by Allflex USA. The winner will be notified in October 2015. The scholarship will be presented at the 2015 Angus Means Business National Convention & Trade Show, Nov. 6, 2015, in Overland Park, Kan.

Upon receipt of a completed application, it will be considered by a committee from the American Angus Association and Allflex USA. Emphasis will be placed on the applicant's future agricultural career path and their beef industry passion.

Applicant Qualifications

1. Applicant or applicant's parents/guardians must have transferred or have been transferred a registration paper in the last 36 months (On or after May 1, 2012). Applicant or applicant's parents/guardians must have an affiliate member code or currently be a member of the American Angus Association.
2. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior or must be enrolled in a technical school, junior college, four-year college/university or other accredited institution of higher education for the spring term (2016) in any agriculture field of study.
3. The scholarship applicant will be required to verify their enrollment in a technical school, junior college, four-year college/university or other accredited institution of higher education before the scholarship award check will be issued. Failure to meet enrollment requirements will result in forfeiture of the scholarship.
4. Should the recipient fail to complete at least one semester of full-time enrollment in an accredited or approved institution of higher education prior to Dec. 31, 2016, for any reason, scholarship funds must be refunded to the American Angus Association.
5. Applicant must be enrolled in Future Angus Stockmen program.

Applicants can only receive Future Angus Stockmen scholarship once.

- 1) Use 2015 Future Angus Stockmen application.
- 2) Be signed and dated by the applicant.
- 3) Postmarked by U.S. Postal Service by Sept. 30, 2015.
- 4) Include copy of most current transcript.
- 5) Application must not exceed five pages in length.

Sept. 30, 2015, is the absolute deadline for mailing applications. NOTE: Materials must be postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service on or before Sept. 30, 2015. Applications privately metered will not be accepted.
