## Day 2: Monday 7 October

### CHRISTCHURCH to ASHBURTON

Today the tour travels north from Christchurch to the picturesque Greta Valley to Woodbank Stud, one of New Zealand's earliest premier studs. Then on to Te Mania, which is New Zealand's largest Angus stud and has the oldest performance recorded herd in the country. Following lunch, the tour will travel down the main highway south, flanked by the majestic Southern Alps mountain range. Dinner is at your hotel tonight.

## Day 3: Tuesday 8 October

### ASHBURTON

Today brings variety, starting with a visit to Copelands to see commercial steers grazing on grass, and then onto Five Star Feedlot, the only commercial feedlot in New Zealand. This afternoon, to include lunch, will be spent visiting the picturesque Kakahu Stud and gardens; another of New Zealand's largest studs. From here a visit to Stern Angus, an internationally recognised stud, before returning to Methven for the evening with dinner and entertainment.

## Day 4: Wednesday 9 October

### ASHBURTON to MT COOK

Today begins in Methven and concludes at the foot of New Zealand's tallest mountain, Aoraki Mt Cook. In between, you will visit Meadowslea, an Angus stud and prime lamb producer. Lunch is at Braemar - a high country commercial farming operation where you will see the skill of the New Zealand sheep dog in action. Later, head into the foothills of the Southern Alps. A very special night is planned at the Hermitage Hotel in Aoraki Mt Cook village.

## Day 5: Thursday 10 October

### MT COOK to QUEENSTOWN

See high fashion Merino clothing, experienced spinners working with the superfine wool, and blade shearing. Helicopter scenic flights will be available (optional) for those who wish to view this alpine region from above. Continue south with a stop at Lake Wanaka for afternoon tea on the shores of the lake before continuing south, travelling through vineyards en route to your magnificent alpine destination, Queenstown. Dinner at hotel.

## Day 6: Friday 11 October

### QUEENSTOWN

Following lunch, tours will be conducted around the property to demonstrate the key features and activities of Rangitaiki Station. The youth programme competition and activities will also be held here today for delegates to enjoy.

The day will conclude with a panel discussion by today's speakers and an auction of the best of the Angus heifers from the youth programme, followed by an early dinner before departing back to Rotorua.
