## NOTES:

Your application is due a few months sooner than student applications are. This is to allow us an opportunity to recruit a larger pool based on host interest.

The internship selection committee works to ensure we only recommend good pairings. For this reason, it is possible you will not be paired if the committee doesn't feel we have a suited student. If this is the case, we ask and encourage you to apply again in subsequent seasons. We also arrange a virtual meeting between you and the selected intern. This provides both of you an opportunity to opt-out, if necessary, before the internship. It is important to have the right student on the right farm/ranch for the best experience for both you and the student.

If you are selected to host, you will be asked to provide documentation of on-farm liability insurance coverage.

Availability of internships are limited by availability of hosts, suitable interns and available funds from the Angus Foundation's Angus/Talon Youth Educational Learning Program Endowment Fund.
